## Rowley Park Academy Sports Premium

The Government in England has provided additional funding of over **£150 million per annum** since 2013/14 to improve PE and school sport in primary schools. From September 2017, the funding will be doubled to enable primary schools to make further improvements to the quality and breadth of the PE and sport they offer. The fund is ring-fenced and can only be spent on PE and school sport provision in schools.

For the 2016/17 Academic Year, Rowley Park Primary Academy has received £9,010 of funding from the PE and Sports Premium funding to develop and consider the impact of:

- Achievement in weekly PE lessons;
- Increased participation in competitive school sport;
- Personal health and well-being;
- Improved attitudes and behaviour towards learning

At Rowley Park Academy we support healthy living and the sports premium helps us to introduce children to new sports and to become more skilled in the everyday sports. We know that sports, in themselves, do not just deliver physical benefits. They help children to learn to be disciplined, to take turns, (good sportsmanship) to struggle and to strive to do their best. Children are often more prepared to do this in an outdoor or sports environment than in the classroom. We must utilise these characteristics of sport and look to transfer them to the classroom. The social aspects of sport can also often be beneficial to all children, and confidence and wellbeing can develop from taking part in physical activities. However, some children do not enjoy physical activity; they may be overweight or poor in their coordination or confidence and thus they feel alienated from these kinds of activities, when there are some children that we most want to inspire to be active.

At Rowley Park Academy our goals are:

- **For all children to take part in regular and structured physical activity, and enjoy doing so**
- **For children's skills and competence in physical activity to grow**
- **To increase participation**
- **To embed the idea of regular exercise as an essential part of life**

We have therefore been focusing on key actions to be able to achieve these goals:

1. PE leader needs to monitor provision, standards of PE and to monitor and implement PE spending plan
2. Staff & PE leader CSPD needs are varied across the school
3. Increase opportunities for competitive sports across the school.
4. Health and Safety – Hall Floor. Teaching of gymnastics and Dance effected due to condition of floor
5. Lack of equipment to support high quality skill development.
