Large Plate Challenges

Design your own coat of arms for your family. It needs to have 4 sections to it describing what your family is like.

Identify a castle in England. Research facts about this castle and create an information sheet which includes an image.

Write a poem that describes an aspect of Castle life. Use your descriptive language to form interesting sentences in your poem.

Research which parts of a castle were used for defence. Create a design for a castle with labels. Create a model of your castle to display at our final banquet or reenactment.

Design a menu for a banquet. You need to have 3 courses with 3 choices for each course. Complete questionnaires to find out which dishes people would prefer. Create your final menu, and design that can be presented.

Plan an important speech that needs to be given at a Castle banquet. Research a particular significant event that happened in the past. Plan a speech to inform guests about what is happening.

Once you have designed your menu, complete market research by creating a questionnaire to ask at least 6 people to find out which of your dishes that they prefer. From what you find out, create your final menu, and create a final design that can be presented at a banquet.	
Write a poem that describes an aspect of Castle life. It could describe the Castle itself, or someone living in the Castle such as a soldier or a member of the important family. Use your descriptive language to form interesting sentences in your poem – it does not have to rhyme unless you chose it to!		Plan an important speech that needs to be given at a Castle banquet. Research a particular time period and a significant event that happened in that time period. Imagine that you are part of this event, and your speech needs to inform guests about what is happening. Research key facts that you would need to share; or use your imagination to create any aspects that you cannot find out. Develop a first draft, edit and develop to create your final speech to share at the banquet or re-enactment.
