
Staffordshire County Council have asked us to communicate the following information:

Currently anyone who has one of the main symptoms of persistent cough, high temperature, new cough or loss of taste or smell must self-isolate immediately and book a test. However, with many people displaying other symptoms, we are asking residents in Staffordshire to consider getting tested as a precaution if they have other symptoms such as:

 Headaches • Aches and pains • Feeling very tired for no good reason • Sore throat • Runny nose •
 Sneezing • Sometimes 'tummy ache' in children

People with any of these symptoms can carry on going to school or work if they are well enough to do so and only need to self-isolate if the test comes back positive.

As a school we would advise that if your child displays symptoms that worry you, please speak to your GP or call 111 for advice on whether your child should be tested.



Across Staffordshire, a look for a light campaign is running that works a bit like the rainbows.

It is encourage families to make a lantern out of recycled materials (milk carton, jar etc...) decorate them and then display in the window for people to spot on the above date. School will provide battery operated tea lights for any child that would like one for their lantern.
