New Coronavirus Guidance.

The government guidance changed on 1st April. The rules for your children now are as follows:

From 1 April, anyone with a positive COVID-19 test result will be advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious. **For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be three days. Children can return to school after the three days spent at home, avoiding contact with others. There is no expectation that negative tests need to be provided for children to return.**

The school will provide remote learning for children that are well enough to complete it. If your child is positive for COVID please let the office know and to let us know if we work is required.
