NICER

Our challenge this term is to create a breakfast that is locally sourced for our families. Children will explore the differences between urban and rural areas. They will also find out about fruits and vegetables that grow locally. We will take a trip to Lower Drayton Farm where children will learn all about how our food gets from the farm to our local supermarkets! The children will also be investigating what might impact crops growing. We will compare our local area to a small village in Kenya and discuss the similarities and differences. In Art, we will be creating sculptures inspired by Barbara Hepworth. Children will also use their computing skills to understand how algorithms work!

This term, we will be writing a range of genres. We will start off by writing a diary entry of what really happened in the story of The Three Little Pigs. We will be writing about the events from the wolf's perspective. For our non fiction texts, we will be writing menus and instructions to go alongside the breakfast we are making. We will be exploring poetry through, "What the Ladybird Heard" and learning through a wide range of stories including: Farmer Duck, Little Red Hen, Farmyard Hullabaloo and The Enormous Turnip.

Maths

This term children will build on their number skills by introducing money, whereby, they will be learning to: recognise a range of coins and notes, add and subtract money amounts and solve problems. After, we will be moving onto multiplication and-division. Here the children will baild on previous learning and will be taught new methods to solve these calculations. After half term, the children will be continuing their focus on 'measurement' and we will explore length, height, capacity and mass.
