Challenge Curriculum

Our challenge curriculum this term is 'The Toymaker's Apprentice'. The outcome for this challenge pack is to create a toy to encourage communication between younger children. Throughout this challenge pack, we will be looking at significant inventions and their impact on society and life throughout history. We will be using Stop Motion in computing to create an advert for the toy we will be creating in DT. The children will also be completing some market research to influence their ideas.

Maths

Throughout the term, children will be exploring a variety of topics within Maths. These include: Decimals, Money, Time, Shape, Statistics and Position and Direction.

Alongside this, children are encouraged to practice their times tables, which can be accessed on TT Rockstars or a copy of the times tables can be sent home on request.

P.E
