

# Autumn Term -Year 6

# English

In English we will be writing in a range of genres beginning with a speech about what makes a good team captain. Children will also be writing stories with unusual settings and instructions. For each genre we will be focusing on well-chosen words, varied sentence structure and introduce punctuation such as dashes, semi-colons etc.

## Maths

This term in Maths this term we will be covering place value to identify numbers to 10,000,000 along with negative numbers. Also, we will be exploring adding/subtracting numbers with up larger numbers and ensuring children have secure written methods for multiplying and dividing (this will include methods for long multiplication and division). Towards Christmas we will begin to learn about fractions: simplifying, adding and subtracting them.

### P.E

Our PE sessions will be on Mondays (with a Forest school session on Tuesdays)
We would advise children to bring their kit in on a Monday and bring it home on a Friday. PE kit must be worn (white t-shirt with dark shorts) No football strips are allowed.

Earrings must be removed or covered with a plaster.

This term we will be considering 'What would Jesus do? and how this helps Christians in their everyday lives. After half term we will learn 'Why do Hindus want to be good?' and about how Hindus teachings supports people to 'do good'.

#### Homework

This year, children will get new spellings every two weeks. These will be in their homework diaries linked to a spelling rule or pattern We will be working on these in school but children need to learn these spellings at home.

Children have a login for **Times Table Rockstars** to support learning multiplication facts.

A written maths tasks will be giving weekly – this will be a similar format to our lesson tasks (chilli challenges). Children will work the 1-2 of the challenges given. This will be given on a Monday and needs to be returned by the following Monday. Please continue to read with your child daily where possible and record this in your child's Homework diary. Children should bring their homework diary in everyday.
